WORLD HEARING DAY (3rd MARCH 2020)

On the occasion of World Hearing Day 2020, an ear awareness and screening camp was organized by Ministry of Health and Family Welfare, Government of India in collaboration with Society for Sound Hearing and Department of Community Medicine and Department of ENT, Department of ENT, Lady Harding Medical College and ALPS International at Nirman Bhawan on 3th March, 2020. Dr. Anil Kumar Deputy Director, National Programme for Prevention and Control of Deafness, Ministry of Health & Family Welfare, Government of India, facilitated the conduct of the screening programme. Dr. Rajiv Garg, Director General of Health Services, Ministry of Health & Family Welfare, Government of India was part of programme, Dr. Manas Roy Pritam, Additional Deputy General, Nirman Bhawan, New Delhi





As part of the screening program, 295 beneficiaries were screened. 184 of the individuals screened were males while 111 were females. The age of the participants varied from 20 years to 70 years. The participants were first screened for any hearing problem using screening proforma which included details of individual's history. This was followed by ear examination by ENT specialists and those requiring audiometric assessment, were further

evaluated in a separate room by audiometrists. The audiometric services were provided by ALPS International.

Dr. Harsh Vardhan, Minister of Health, Ministry of Health & Family Welfare, Government of India was Chief Guest of Screening Programme.



World Hearing Day, 2020 was celebrated at Lok Nayak Hospital by organizing a special screening camp for general public in ENT OPD, 6th Floor, Lok Nayak Hospital, New Delhi. A number of 150 patients were screened.

WHO APW project on capacity building material for training of manpower

WHO APW project on capacity building material for training of manpower under National Programme for Prevention and Control of Deafness (NPPCD) as per APW P.O. Number 202572048 Dated 05/08/2020 entitled “To build the capacity of community health workers and medical officers to improve ear and hearing care” is initiated. The site evaluation tool was prepared and sent to all the state nodal officers for taking detail information from district level healthcare staff as well trainings. After that, the training presentation will be prepared for all level health care manpower under NPPCD programme.

An online meeting was organized to sensitize the state nodal officers regarding initiation of training of available untrained staff. Dr. Arun Agarwal, former Dean, MAMC, New Delhi and Addl. DGHS, MoHFW, Govt. of India talked about different levels of training and suggested that medical colleges can be part of available training infrastructure. Dr. Suneela Garg, Prof. of Excellence and HAG, Dept. of Community Medicine, MAMC, New Delhi told how training can be planned step by step from Grassroot level worker to Medical Officer. She mentioned that after getting feedback from the State Nodal Officers we would be able to find out gaps in training and compiled the data to arrange details of trained and untrained staff which would be helpful in planning of different level of training of manpower under National Programme for Prevention and Control of Deafness.
